From the Pastor:

"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot behind. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." – Matthew 5: 14-16

Dear Ones:

When I was a little girl, like most children then and now, I couldn't wait for the end of the school year. The reason I couldn't wait was because I got to leave the city of Boston where I lived until middle school to spend most of the summer with my grandparents. They had moved from Boston out to the "country" to what was then, rural Ipswich. I couldn't wait for the warm weather and the opportunity to go barefoot in the grass and climb trees, pick wild blackberries and catch tadpoles in the creek down the road. One of my other favorite activities was sitting on the front porch with my grandparents after supper and waiting for the sun to go down. The hot, humid summer air would grow still, the crickets would chirp loudly, and my sister and I would sit on the front stairs waiting anxiously for it to grow dark. We were waiting for the fireflies to make their appearance so that we could catch them with the empty jelly jars my grandmother would save for us. We would run all over the yard giggling, laughing and jumping with glee whenever we made a successful catch. However, even though I tried to create a hospitable environment for the fireflies to thrive in the jar by placing grass and twigs inside it and puncturing holes in the lid, they didn't thrive, they died. After a while, my sister and I gave up. We took pity on the poor insects and became content to just sit and watch them light upon the lawn. We realized that they couldn't shine their light if they were contained in the jar. They had to be free in order to do so.

As an adult, it has occurred to me that when I was a child, my joy was always evident. There was no restraint, nothing that prevented me from shining the light within me. If I were joyful, I had no inhibitions or embarrassment about showing it. If I was happy, I was spontaneous in expressing it. I laughed, I danced, I sang.

The long-ago summers spent with my grandparents are some of the most fond and pleasant childhood memories I have. Those happy days were filled with simple pleasures and uncomplicated joy. I realize now that something happens as we grow older, sometimes the light inside us dims or we restrain ourselves from emitting the joy and light that is within us.

The season of Pentecost reminds me that the Spirit of God is the light within us all and as followers of Jesus we are called to let that light within us shine. Do those who meet you recognize the light within as the light and love of Christ? If not, what prevents you from stoking the flame so that your light will burn brighter?

The next time you see a firefly, may it remind you that you have a bright light to shine as well. It is the light of God, so "Let it shine, let it shine, let it shine!"

God loves you and so do I.



To: The members of the Groveland Congregational Church, a member of the United Church of Christ, in Groveland, Massachusetts.

Greetings: In accordance with Article V, Section A, Paragraph 2 of the bylaws, you are hereby notified that the 294th Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, June 6, 2021 at 10 AM via Zoom to vote on the following articles:

- **Article 1**: To view and receive the 2020 reports of the Officers, Ministers, Teams and Organizations of the church.
- **Article 2**: To see if the church will vote to accept the revisions to the 2019 Bylaws as presented by the Bylaws Team.
- **Article 3**: To hear and act on the nominations from the Nominating Team.
- **Article 4**: To see if the church will vote to reimburse Lewis Harrold in the amount of \$6,729.64 with funds from the Music Fund for the purchase of equipment necessary to implement the mission of the Communications and Technology Team and to acknowledge his donation of the additional \$2206 worth of equipment necessary to do the same.
- Article 5: To see if the church will vote to fund the mission of the Communications and Technology Team for the 2021-2022 church year in the amount of \$5800 to cover labor and up to \$800 in recurring software and other fees.
- **Article 6:** To see if the church will vote to accept the budget as presented.
- **Article 7:** To see if the church will continue to sponsor Boy Scout Troop 87, Cub Scout Pack 113, and Venture Crew 113.
- **Article 8**: To act on any other business that may properly come before the Church at this time.
